The kitchen's solar-powered cooking system is not only eco-friendly but also reduces cooking time and fuel consumption. Students got a chance to observe bulk cooking by using solar energy steaming process, walk-in cold rooms and dough mixing machine with a capacity of up to 12,000 kg with 23,000 roti's in one meal.

After visiting the mega kitchen, students were taken to the WIC & Reveilo winery, nestled in the picturesque vineyards of Nashik. Next day session started with a presentation on grape to glass session by sommelier & co-founder of WIC Mr. Vikrant Holkar.

The winery tour was informative and engaging, offering insights into the wine-making process. From grape harvesting to bottling, every step is carefully crafted to produce exceptional wines.




